

AMAZON.CO.UK OFFERS THE FIFTH HARRY POTTER BOOK FOR IMMEDIATE PRE-ORDER AT 50% DISCOUNT

LONDON: January 15, 2003--just hours after Bloomsbury announced that the long-awaited fifth book, *Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix*, in JK Rowling's spellbinding Harry Potter series will be published on June 21, 2003, Amazon.co.uk (www.amazon.co.uk) announced that customers can, effective immediately, place orders for *Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix* (Book 5) at a 50 per cent discount on the list price of £16.99 to ensure they receive their copy when it becomes available in stores.
