The all-new Kindle is thinner and lighter and has twice the memory compared to the previous generation Kindle. Available in black and white colour options, the new Kindle features a more rounded design, making it easy and comfortable to hold in one hand at any angle for extended reading sessions. Unlike reflective tablet and smartphone screens, the high contrast touchscreen display on Kindle eliminates glare in any setting, even in direct sunlight. Recent studies by the Harvard Health Publication have shown that evening exposure to blue light from backlit screens like tablets and smartphones can suppress the body's production of melatonin, a naturally occurring hormone that helps the body fall asleep. Because the Kindle display emits no light, you can read anytime without losing sleep. Like all Kindle e-readers, the all-new Kindle has a battery life that lasts for weeks and not hours.

- Export Notes—It's now easy to export notes and highlights from a book to your e-mail, so you can always have them on-hand for reference.
